ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2016/78

Quicklime

Exported from Malaysia, the Kingdom of Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Extension of time granted to issue Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 18 April 2016, I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of quicklime (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia, the Kingdom of Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2016/40. This ADN is available on the internet at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

The initiation notice for this investigation advised that the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by 6 August 2016.

To enable me to complete my enquiries in relation to the alleged dumping of the goods and the injury claims made by the applicant, Cockburn Cement Limited, and to complete the remaining verification of exporters' and importers' data, I requested an extension of time under subsection 269ZHI(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to publish the SEF.

The Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary)¹ has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 10 October 2016. Interested parties are invited to make submissions in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary in relation to this investigation will now be made in a report due on or before 24 November 2016.

¹ The Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science has delegated responsibility with respect to anti-dumping matters to the Parliamentary Secretary, and accordingly, the Parliamentary Secretary is the relevant decision maker. On 19 July 2016, the Prime Minister appointed the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science as the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science.
