## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2016/125**

#### Quicklime

## Exported from Malaysia, the Kingdom of Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

### **Termination of Investigation**

Public notice under subsection 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 18 April 2016, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of quicklime (the goods) exported to Australia from Malaysia, the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand) and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (Vietnam), following an application lodged by Cockburn Cement Limited under subsection 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of my decision not to reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (the Commission) website on 18 April 2016 (Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2016/40 refers). The ADN is available at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

As a result of my investigation, I am satisfied that:

- in relation to Unichamp Mineral, there has been no dumping by this exporter of any
  of the goods the subject of the application and, therefore, I have terminated the
  investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(1)(b) of the Act so far as it
  relates to Unichamp Mineral; and
- there has been or may be, dumping of some or all of the goods (other than exports by Unichamp Mineral) but the injury to the Australian industry, that has been, or may be, caused by that dumping is negligible and, therefore, I have terminated the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(13A)(b) of the Act so far as it relates to Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam.

In making the decisions to terminate, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, *Statement of Essential Facts* (SEF) *No. 348*, submissions in response to that SEF, and other relevant information.

Termination Report 348, which sets out reasons for the termination decisions, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decisions are based, has been placed on the Commission's public record at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

The applicant may request a review of this decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this public notice.
